

# Instructions

## Correct procedure for completing and submitting the examination

1. Always read the entire question and each answer carefully.
2. **Question type A – Single choice:** Each question is followed by three to five answers. Select the one answer that you believe is appropriate:
  - If the question is worded positively, select **the only correct or the most appropriate answer**, respectively.
  - If the question is worded negatively, select **the only exception, the only incorrect answer, or the answer that appears least appropriate** (the **negation** is written in **bold**), respectively.

**Kprime question type – four true/false options:** Each question or incomplete statement is followed by four answers or statement completions. Decide whether **each statement is true or false**.

Independent of the grammatical formulation of the question in singular or plural, 1, 2, 3, 4 or none of the answers may be correct.

3. **Answer all the questions.** If you are not sure, select the answer you believe is most likely.

You will be awarded one point for each correct answer and half a point for three correct partial answers to the Kprime questions.

No points are deducted for incorrect answers.

Any unanswered question is rated incorrect and awarded 0 points.

4. Do not submit the exam until you have answered all the questions and completed the entire examination.

## Visiting the toilet

## Objections to exam questions

As well as the statistical insights, objectively justified objections to exam questions are of great importance to the evaluation. Legitimate remarks concerning


- conflicting teaching opinions on the content of a question
- ambiguous wording
- other substantive issues

may lead to the subsequent removal of a question.

General comments and emotionally laden judgements (question unclear, stupid question, question must be removed) along with comments on why one answer rather than another was chosen are basically futile, however.

Given the limited time available for evaluating the examinations, comments can only be considered if they are comprehensible and concise.
